Our guest speaker, Lisa Siganto, comes from a large family who are involved in business and believe in giving back to the community or contributing to improve the world. Lisa's career has taken her from Brisbane to a Harvard MBA. After several years of consulting to high profile big businesses, she became disillusioned with what she saw as profit for profit's sake and keeping it in the hands of a few – including criminal corruption by some CEOs. Lisa has, for the last 20 years, focussed on either working with, or investing in, businesses who contribute to social change and allow for ethical investment which allows people to invest in companies that align with their values. An interesting statistic, which many were not aware of, is the extremely low proportion of femaleled businesses who receive investment – approx. 2-3% of all businesses. Yet, these are the businesses who often have cultural, environmental, and social values around their products, services and operations. If we could imagine how much more profitable or viable these businesses could be but for the lack of capital investment.

This was thought provoking presentation which certainly had many members discussing its merits after the meeting ended.

Susan introduced her guests Pam Quinn and Mary Matandiko, Project Co-ordinator for Our Rainbow House, a school for disadvantaged children in a community near Lusaka Zambia. The school, an Australian and Zambian Registered Charity, was founded by a small committee based in Emerald QLD. Mary spoke to us about her work at the school and the generous sponsorship and support given by Australian sponsors including the Rotary Club of Emerald. Our Rainbow House was modelled on the School of St Jude and like St Judes and our Mamba Primary school is achieving outstanding results.

We have another Board meeting this week. I know that some of the Directors have had committee meetings & look forward to hearing from them. I'm sure a President is only as good as his/her Board & I am really enjoying their support so far. While the eradication of fistula in Ethiopia once seemed impossible, it is becoming a reality that will be achieved due to the growing movement of generous supporters who are determined to see this dream come true.

Carolyn was appointed Chief Executive Officer of the Catherine Hamlin Fistula Foundation in February 2016.

Prior to that she worked with the United Nations for over twelve years in senior leadership roles including private sector relations at the UN Trust Fund to End Violence Against Women and Global Head of Private Sector Relations at UN Women in New York, Deputy Director of UNICEF's Global Private Funding & Partnerships Division in Geneva and CEO of UNICEF Australia. Carolyn has also served as a Director on the Global Board of Amnesty International and Director of ChildFund Australia.
