## Mamba Primary School Project—Tanzania

Bill Phillips shared Rotary of Brisbane High-Rise's involvement with Mamba School.



Seeing we are off to visit the Mamba School, located on the lower slopes of Mount Kilimanjaro in Tanzania, in early January it's worth reviewing our involvement with the school featuring a series of projects over the last 12 years or so. It all started through a visit by Noela Phillips to the school in early 2007. The deplorable state of school facilities and the total lack of school resources were clearly apparent.

Our first project was the provision of a water tank; the school had no water supply; the children had a lengthy hike each day to fetch water. The tank was financed out of the sale of Melbourne Cup trifecta tickets; this was the first of many packs of tickets sold to provide the seed money to fund the various projects.

The first Club visit to the school occurred in 2012; this led to the provision of funds (four packs of trifecta tickets were sold that year) to build a new classroom.

We then "discovered" the availability of District and Global grants which meant the funds we generated had a considerable multiplier effect. We initiated a grant application which turned \$12k available through Club resources into a \$37K project. This money financed the building of two new classrooms, a new kitchen(plus provision of cooking facilities such as fuel – efficient stoves), a library and a new toilet block.

One of the conditions for grant approval was the need for a local Rotary Club to partner in the project. We were fortunate, after a lengthy search, to secure contact with the Rotary Club of Mkuu Rombo. Mamba School is located in the District of Rombo. This Club through one of its members, Kimario, project managed all our building projects subject to grant approval.

Following another High – Rise visit in 2017 the idea of building a dining hall for the school originated. (by Russell!) This prompted another grant application which was approved and led to our biggest single project at the school. The dining hall morphed into a community hall that could seat 450 people (comfortably). The hall was completed in early 2019 and now not only serves the needs of the school but also the local community.

Our latest project was to build an additional new toilet block. The facilities that existed at that time, although new, were insufficient to serve the needs of the whole school community. The funding for this project was supported by a District grant.

Building projects are not the only support we have given the Mamba school. Aided by another District grant we connected electricity to the school in 2016. Another little project was to supply all the kids in the school with school jumpers (it gets quite cold on the slopes of Kilimanjaro). Through individual donations we also furnished the community hall with desks and seating.

On each of the five occasions that we visited Mamba school we took teaching resources and aids. In 2019 we provided sufficient resources for every student in the school to last through the year.

The consequence of this support for the Mamba school is best highlighted in teaching outcomes. In Tanzania children sit for a national public exam at the end of Year 7. Passing is conditional to move on to high school. At the start of the High – Rise involvement in the school the pass rate was 15%; it is now more than 90%. That's the High – Rise impact on this one little school.
