He regularly spends three months of his professional year in war-torn & third-world countries as part of a team of professional & non-professional volunteers giving specialist aid to underprivileged countries. MSF was started in 1971 by a group of French doctors & contributing to their worldwide acclaim was the presentation of the 1999 Nobel Peace Prize.
