Previously, a highly admired Doctor and now a 'lowly' student making little progress in an unfamiliar country.

I discussed Ivan's predicament with my colleagues & we decided to step in and help. I called the Mater Children's Hospital & explained Ivan's situation. After some consideration, they agreed to allow him to sit in a consultation room and observe the way Doctors in Australia carried out their work. He was able to recognise the common professional language & improve his listening skills hugely. He became a new man! He became a new man!

Years later I ran into Ivan and he was working at the Mater in his old role. I guess he and I together had both imagined Dr Ivan in a white coat doing the work he loved.

And we are currently being asked to Imagine Rotary in a similar way.
