#### A BIT OF GAS FROM THE PRESIDENT – BARBARA LEDDY

Another great meeting this week with an inspiring speaker. Thank you Dylys for bringing us Fiona Caniglia to demonstrate what a valuable role Q Shelter has in our Queensland community, helping the homelessness & housing situation throughout our state. Q Shelter's vision is that every Queenslander has a home.

Every week when we have a guest speaker, \$20 is given on their behalf to the Albert Park Flexible Learning Centre. Brisbane High Rise has been involved with the school since 2006 and I thought it would be meaningful for new members to learn a little about one of our key beneficiaries

Albert Park is a learning centre for homeless and disadvantaged youth within our community. Albert Park Flexible Learning Centre (APFLC) began in 1990 at the Albert Park Amphitheatre as an education initiative by the Brisbane City Council for homeless young people. It was founded by Matron Gwen Zietch. The organisation provides a unique environment where young people who have been marginalised from mainstream education through personal and family circumstances can rebuild to become productive members of society. To this end, attendees are able to improve their circumstances by obtaining both formal and life education within a community environment. The organisational model is founded on the principles of Rights, Respect, Relationship, and Responsibility within a safe and legal framework and this creates a positive and supportive atmosphere. atmosphere.

The opportunities within our society for young people without a basic year 12 education are limited and Albert Park fulfills an important role in providing a learning environment for key literary and numeracy skills as well as providing exposure to art, music, sport, and life skills. The need for this type of organisation has become more evident in recent years with a large number of centres created around the country to cater for the demand.

Brisbane High Rise has had a close relationship with Albert Park since 2006 and the club's efforts are greatly appreciated by the school management. We have a special position within the community and are regarded as a partner. Dr. Tim Baker (Former HR member) was the Youth Director in the early years of the club and was successful in

obtaining a grant of \$10,000 for the forerunner of APFLC. The focus of the club's activities was initially hands-on projects such as raising bench seats built for primary schools and internal painting of the administration building. This was progressively expanded to district grants, bursaries, and youth programs.

Since then, the club has been a significant contributor to the schools activities by providing developmental funding and hands-on support. In particular, the club has taken the position of a de facto parents and citizen's organisation to the school through providing assistance or having performed activities in regard to the following:

- Community grants (Food4Life and others)
  Physical activities (painting, construction, and landscaping)
  Discretionary funding (co-ordinator support)
- **Bursaries**
- Rotary programs (RYLA) Event attendance (Celebration & Graduation Functions)

Many young people at Albert Park Flexible Learning Centre have low food security, limited nutritional knowledge, and a low capacity to prepare economical, nutritious food. Brisbane City High Rise Rotary and Albert Park FLC saw the Food 4 Life project as a means of providing healthy food options, nutritional education, and resources that could be utilised in the young person's life. Food 4 Life brought together a nutritionist from PCYC, the kitchen coordinator from Albert Park, teachers of maths, English, and ILS, as well as project oversight from the HoC at Albert Park FLC and the PCYC Youth Worker. Steve Settle from Brisbane High Rise Rotary was instrumental in planning the project.

There is much more to be known & digested about High Rise's involvement with Albert Park but I don't have space for much more in this message. The High Riseguru in our projects with Albert Park is Steve Settle whom I thank sincerely for helping me write this missive!


