Today we toast the Rotaract Club of Grenada. The club meets at 6:00 PM every Wednesday. In the aftermath of Hurricane Ivan in 2004, Grenada's national library suffered significant damage and eventually had to close down. However, the Rotaract Club of Grenada sought to challenge the perception of decay and show the nation's high literacy rate. In July 2022, they built three book boxes resembling Little Free Libraries, placing them in popular parks in the p

arish of St. George, near the capital. Additionally, they renovated the library at Mt. Moritz Anglican School, providing new shelves, desks, and a fresh coat of paint. These efforts aimed to make reading materials more accessible to the public and promote a culture of reading in Grenada.

...around the world

... in California, USA Since 2007, the Rotary Club of Cameron Park has collected used bicycles and delivered them to Folsom Prison, where inmates repair them. Rotarians then gift up to 500 of these refashioned rides each year to school children from low-income households and to organizations serving homeless people, veterans and refugees.

... in Uruguay where the Rotary Club of Fray Bentos scooped up 320 servings of paella during a cook-off that has raised thousands of dollars for activities since 2016. The Club which maintains a bank of wheelchairs, crutches, walkers, and canes loaned at no charge to people in need - has used the proceeds for the construction of 16 wheelchair-accessible ramps throughout the city.

.. and in Indonesia - Since 2015, Jakarta Metropolitan Rotary Club has offered free health checkups for people in need. In February, when screenings were expanded to include homeless people, X-rays detected signs of tuberculosis, bronchitis, or pneumonia in 97 of the 223 people screened. The club is now helping overcome barriers to treatment.

... as the Youth Exchange program resumes

Rotary youth are again being offered the opportunity to experience life as a Year 12 student in another country. Hugh Bunce, son of High-Rise Club member David Bunce - himself a former Rotary Exchange student - is off to Denmark next January. Hearing about such a life-changing trip from this

engaging and articulate young man is a real pleasure in store.

I've been meaning to update you on the latest with John and I. We moved to the Aveo Complex at the Gasworks in mid-2021 and and sold our long-term home at Harcourt street at the end of last year.

As some of you may be aware, a large part of the reason for the move was that John was diagnosed with Dementia and Parkinson's in late 2020. John and I had been concerned about some symptoms that he had developed and although it was very difficult to hear the diagnosis, John was relieved to have the uncertainty about his condition removed.

After a year of John and I living independently at Aveo, John moved to Aged Care at the Opal complex at the Gasworks. This is handy for me as I can pop down in the lift and visit John whenever I like. John was still able to move relatively freely and we celebrated our 50th wedding anniversary last August. It was a wonderful day surrounded by family and some of the people who were with us at our wedding.







With the passage of time, John's symptoms have continued to advance and he is now largely confined to bed or a wheelchair. Although John's physical mobility is limited, he still has a healthy appetite and his spirit is undimmed mention a familiar name and a hearty smile emerges. Our children Marissa and Andrew visit frequently and we are fortunate to have had the time to create new memories together with John as a family.
