Today we toast the Rotary Club of Chincha - Peru. The club meets at 8:00 PM every Thursday. In March, the club added to a shelter for vulnerable girls in the Ica region. The first building with a 30 resident capacity was built in 2000, but soon the number of girls living there doubled. In 2018, the club

added three new structures costing about \$35,000 each. The project was funded by donations from the Rotary Club of Flawil, Switzerland, and District 2000, with additional funds raised by the Chincha club.

FROM THE PRESIDENT – BARBARA LEDDY

Last week we had the pleasure of meeting Syd Owen from Toowoomba. Syd is the Area Governor looking after a cluster of clubs in Brisbane. Syd spoke a little about his life outside Rotary as a professional photographer having taken on the business from his father many years ago.

Syd also explained that he took on the Rotary role from a previously appointed AG due to illness. The distance between Toowoomba & his new cluster of clubs has created a barrier to him meeting personally with the Presidents of the clubs, so it was a privilege to have him visit us.

Syd explained the function of the Area Governors as being mentors & points of contact for clubs needing help/guidance. They arrange a monthly meeting with the cluster clubs, usually in a locally suitable venue, so that the club Presidents can become acquainted with him/her and each other. Syd's meetings this year had to be on ZOOM, but nevertheless were very successful.

It was a pleasure for the club to meet another keen Rotarian giving his energy & efforts to make the Rotary 'machine' run smoothly.

Fourteen of us had a unique gathering on Friday night when Zanthia & Ann-Maree arranged a fellowship dinner at a Korean Restaurant in the city. The food revealed to us a typical Korean menu with some of us showing how clever we were at 'manning' the barbeque. A fun time was had by all.

A reminder to all members that these fellowship events are a great way to get to know other members more informally, a fact which can enhance the overall friendship of the club.

While most of us are focused on the well-being of our own club, we are fortunate to have some members who are extending their reach into the wider world of Rotary. Both Wendy Protheroe & John Leddy have been invited to be part of selection committees to nominate Rotarians for particular Rotary International roles in the District & Zone. Circuit Breaker Report





The circuit breaker course has now entered its fourth week and the participants are warming up to each other and sharing truthfully about their lives. Independent of the important material we are learning, this is a great support to men who are often reluctant to be honest and vulnerable. We are becoming mates.

We have a growing understanding now of how anger impacts our relationships and how we can use the strategy of a time out whenever we feel it is getting out of hand. Relationships can flourish if both people know they are safe to discuss anything and be truthful without the risk of angry outbursts.

An example of the value we are experiencing is that one of the participants was unable to attend a session and made sure he contacted me and made the time to watch the session with me at a local café. After going through the 30 minute video teaching session together he was very honest and self aware of how his anger had demonstrated itself over the week. We were able to discuss and apply the strategies of the course in a very real way. This is great progress.

Nearly half way through - there are 6 more sessions to go.
