Today we toast the Rotary Club of Vilniaus - Lithuania. The club meets at 12:15 PM every Tuesday. To lift the spirits of health workers responding to the pandemic, the club treated the staff of Vilnius City Clinical Hospi-

tal with pastries "to make them feel appreciated and, hopefully, make them smile a little more often. Over the course of 10 Fridays concluding in late March, the club ordered 600 pastries, at a cost of \$825, from a local bakery.

The first meeting for the New Calendar year was highlighted by an informative presentation from Stephanie Walsh, Head of Campus at Albert Park Flexible Learning Centre. Albert Park has been supported by BHR for many years doing both practical work & offering bursaries.

More recently, we have been redirecting the gift paid to visiting speakers to the school fund. This money has been used in the past months to provide therapy dogs professionally trained to work with victims of trauma.

Stephanie explained that many of the students at Albert Park have been victims of traumatic life experiences which have impeded their ability to succeed in life & learning.

The dogs have proven to be beneficial in their role in improving attendance & providing general wellbeing of the students. The school is looking at increasing the number of attending dogs as the program continues to prove valuable long term.

Jo Westh is on a mission to help vulnerable people in our community, particularly girls and women who experience domestic violence or homelessness.

She is convinced that connection can solve most of our problems. Launching 4 Voices, a charity whose focus is connection, in March 2020, a week before the world shut down due to COVID 19, wasn't planned or ideal.

Jo's determination to build 4 Voices was fuelled by the previous experience she had at Orange Sky.

Her son and his best mate put two washing machines and two dryers into the back of their old van and started washing clothes for people who were homeless in Brisbane.

She happily helped them out for several years during which time she learned a lot about homelessness and the immense difference that connection can make to a person who is marginalised by the majority of the community.

4 Voices delivers social and digital connection services from bright purple vans outfitted with a lot of technology and most importantly coffee/tea-making facilities.

The **Sherpas** depend very much on tourism for their economy and because of COVID and travel restrictions their economy has been heavily hit in recent times.

The proceeds from the evening then will go towards helping the Simigaun Community and in particular towards providing educational materials for its school - a very worthy cause.


