


**Update from St Judes**

The group that recently traveled to Tanzania had the opportunity to meet Irene, which influenced her comments about the visit.


Both Barbara and Rosemary have been in communication with her and plan to write to her again on behalf of the Club, wishing her the best of luck in her upcoming exams.


