sold. They process and sell honey after taking a field trip to view bee cabinets. The first 60 jars of honey, each with 18 ounces, were sold for about \$8 each by Berkelmans, Schut, and two other club members to fund an information board near the beekeepers' stand at the Goois Nature Reserve.

The centre is described as a state-of-the-art community engagement and education hub, providing detailed project information, digital engagement experiences and learning opportunities for visiting members of the public and school groups.

Russell Vine was our dynamic presenter. He gave us an overview of the design & construction involved and provided insight into the massive strategic planning & marketing of the project. We were then let loose in the Explore & Discovery room where we were able to explore past, present & the future of Brisbane's major underground stations. There were touch screens, VR pods & a simulation in 3D on the science of tunnelling to help us embrace the complexity of the projects to be undertaken. When we left, our Kit was still ensconced in his own virtual world developing a sense of just how significantly Cross River Rail will assist Brisbane become a world class city. We hope he was rescued before the onslaught of a group of teenage high school girls who followed us!

Being a 'pure-bred' Brisbane - ite, I can remember a Brisbane serviced by tram lines, trolley busses, diesel busses and, for some, steam trains which spat out coal dust on ladies' frocks. 

Rotarians in Action


