

John Ker, a true gentleman and outstanding Rotarian

Brisbane High-Rise Rotary lost one of its most experienced and respected members recently. With deep sadness we farewell John Innes Ker, who passed away peacefully on 22 September 2023.

A highly respected Rotarian John's active service spanned 52 years. Inducted in 1969, he became Rotary President in Gayndah (1985-1986) and Bundaberg (1997-1998). John then undertook significant District roles before election as 9570 District Governor 2004-2005.

A transfer to Brisbane High-Rise in 2006 saw John continue his substantial contribution at district level, serving on various committees, and as Project Manager (RAWCS) for the Life and Hope Association in Cambodia. John championed youth programs and the Rotary Foundation, being awarded a PHF+8. Significant work was his deep involvement in the enormous task of updating Standard Rotary constitutions and by-laws to satisfy Queensland requirements. When he was no longer able to attend meetings, John was made an Honorary member.

We recall John's kindness and generosity as a mentor, sharing sage advice on all things Rotary. His enthusiasm for the fun and fellowship of Rotary always shone through, he and Kay were regulars at RI Conventions, District conventions and club events. John's wisdom, his wit and humour will be missed by all.

To John's family, his wife Kay, daughter Marissa and son Andrew we send our thoughts and sympathy at this time.

ROTARY AT A GLANCE

Rotarians: 1,178,368 in 36,971 clubs in 528 Districts in 221 countries/geographic areas.


Rotaractors: 165,686 in 11,203 clubs in 504 districts in 181 countries/geographic areas.

Interactors: 326,554 in 14,163 clubs in 486 districts in 144 countries/geographic areas.

Rotary Community Corps members: 200,615 in 15,087 clubs in 267 districts in 101 countries/geographic areas.

As at August 31, 2023, there are 22,762 Rotary members in 985 clubs in 15 districts in Australia, and 6,415 Rotary members in 249 clubs in five districts in New Zealand and the Pacific. In addition, there are 723 Rotaract members in 57 clubs in Australia and 297 Rotaract members in 17 clubs in New Zealand and the Pacific. Australian and New Zealand districts include Nauru, Papua New Guinea, Solomon Islands, Timor Leste, American Samoa, Cook Islands, Fiji, French Polynesia, Kiribati, New Caledonia, Norfolk Island, Samoa, Tonga and Vanuatu, where there are 568 Rotarians in 36 clubs and 224 Rotaractors in 12 clubs.
