Planning for the relaunch of the Art Show is progressing well; we are getting towards the pointy end of the project with less than two months to go before the event is staged.

Entries by artists close off at the end of May. Our Curator, Simone, is happy with the entries to date; as of the 8th May there were 164 entries.

We can display about 350 pieces of art; normally entries are in the vicinity of 700; those entries not on display will be available for sale online. Of note Simone is very happy with the standard of art pieces already entered.
