The Rotary Club of Brisbane High-Rise has committed to raising \$12,000 to provide poor and vulnerable women, who access Maternity Africa's Kivulini Maternity Centre (Kivulini), with essential care packs. Noela and Bill Phillips (Rotarians) visited Kivulini where they learned of the desperate plight of the poorest women and girls giving birth at Kivulini. Dr Browning's inspirational presentation via zoom to one of the Club's regular Thursday morning breakfast meetings prompted the Rotary Club to take action.

In October, they held a very successful movie event at the New Farm Theatre where they raised \$4k! And so far for the year, \$8k! They are well on their way to raising their target of\$12k! We are very grateful to these dedicated Rotarians and generous friends and families for raising this money.

International Toast

This week is **World Interact Week** so we are celebrating the: *Interact Club of Pinhais, Parana, Brazil*



Horrified by stories about an online suicide game called *Blue Whale*, Gabriel Kenji of Brazil decided to create a game to counter the dangerous online trend, and hopefully, save lives.

The *Blue Whale Challenge* is a chilling suicide game allegedly run by a social media group. The game preys on vulnerable adolescents and teenagers, who are instructed to complete a set of challenges over a 50-day period. The tasks begin harmlessly but become increasingly more dangerous, including self-punishing, and end with the teenager being urged to take their own life.

Interactor Gabriel Kenji from Brazil is combating it with *White Whale*, a social media project that promotes peace and self-esteem. "When I first heard about the horrific game, I thought it was a problem far away from Brazil," says Kenji, a member of the Interact Club of Pinhais, Parana, Brazil. "Once it reached my country I realized this type of evil can be anywhere. I had to do something to alert others about the seriousness of the problem."

He devised *White Whale*, a social media game to help boost self-esteem, self-worth, and peaceful interactions among young people.
