Initiated by Julia Heemstra's talk in 2018, the partnership evolved from providing handheld water filters to extensive renovations of kitchens, bathrooms, and water systems, enhancing educational opportunities for children in the region.

22 APRIL 2024 TO 25 APRIL, 2024

Resting peacefully on the eastern beach of K'gari / Fraser Island is the TSS Moheno – during WW1 the Moheno was a hospital ship, arriving at Anzac beach on the morning of 26 August 1915; there the crew retrieved the wounded Australian and New Zealand soldiers. A winter cyclone in 1935 caused the towline to break resulting in the Maheno being beached on Fraser Island, spaning her from the shipbreakers' torches in Japon.
