CARNARVON GORGE/ BUNYA MOUNTAINS ROAD TRIP



Our family is planning a trip with Mette Feldthaus, 2024 Inbound Exchange Student from Denmark. We are planning a road trip to Carnarvon Gorge and the Bunya Mountains in September 2024. Some members have expressed an interest in joining the trip in part or all. All are welcome. The Plan: We will camp, there are always cabins/hotels/pubs and other options available at the other sites. It is a Road Trip. There are a lot of Kilometres, about 1500km, Sunday to Sunday. Dates are:

•	Depart Brisbane, lunch at Chinchilla. (291km from Brisbane to Chinchilla)	Sunday, 15/09/24
•	Chinchilla To Roma, overnight Roma. (181km Chinchilla to Roma)	Sunday, 15/09/24
•	Arrive Carnarvon Gorge (268km from Roma to Carnarvon)	Monday, 16/09/24 (midday)
•	Depart Carnarvon Gorge (268km from Carnarvon to Roma)	Thursday, 19/09/24 (midday)
•	Overnight Roma in local pub	Thursday, 19/09/24
•	Arrive Bunya Mountains Friday, 20/09/24 (323km from Roma to Bunya Mountains)	
•	Depart Bunya Mountains/Arrive Brisbane (238km from Bunyas to Brisbane)	Sunday, 22/09/24

BYO - BYO everything really. 4WD not necessary, I have done this trip in a 2WD sedan before. We will have a full car of our family + Mette, so can't offer spare seats. Much of this is National Park where no dogs are allowed.

Highlights

- On Tuesday, 20 September, we plan to do the main gorge walk at Carnarvon Gorge and a few smaller gorge "explorations" on Wednesday 21 September.
- On Wednesday, 21 September we plan to walk Mick's Gorge which is a short walk, with some rock-hopping see photo above
- On the evening of Friday, 20 September, we plan to investigate Shackleton's Whisky Bar which is adjacent the campgrounds at Bunya Mountains.

Weather - if the weather is "really bad" we will probably only do the Bunya Mountains part as we have been "flooded in" at Carnarvon Gorge after very big rains before.

Rotary- upon investigation, there is no rotary club in Bunya Mountains, nearest is in Dalby who meet on Monday nights. Roma has a club who meet on Thursdays.
