At our High-Rise breakfast last week, Bill gave the floor to Gemma Sisia and her two international guests for a wonderful update on what's happening at the School of St Jude's in Tanzania. This is Gemma's own story – and one that most members of our Rotary family are familiar with.

But to recap for those who are new to our Club, starting with just a handful of students from severely impoverished backgrounds and one teacher, the school was able to open in 2002, due to the support of Rotary in Australia.

Today, numerous Rotary Clubs support St Jude's which now provides free, quality education to 1,800 bright primary and secondary students across three campuses with boarding facilities. It employs around 300 Tanzanian staff. Rotary contributions provide students with scholarships but also mean they can enjoy other benefits including water storage tanks, school buses and solar water heaters to the boarding houses.
