Last week's Meeting

Nicholas Dunstan enthralled us with his insights on the Rotary Youth Leadership Award (RYLA), an intensive leadership program meticulously crafted by Rotary clubs and districts. RYLA serves as a dynamic platform for youths to not only enhance their leadership skills but also to forge meaningful connections and cultivate a spirit of camaraderie.







Valley Hearts

Valley Hearts began operations in Brisbane in 2014 and was incorporated as a "not-for-profit" organisation in 2015.

I is run by Mo and Rata who originally worked together in the Salvation Army but subsequently left to focus more on the care of those living locally on the streets, living rough and on hard times.

Their operations began from the back of a ute when they followed the food trucks at night and provided food and comfort to these in need. They later upgraded operations to a storage shed. As demand and resources have increased, they started to work from a house in Terrace Street, and in 2021 leased premises in Fortitude Valley from where donations are temporarily stored and activities organised.

Since its inception, over 100 volunteers have come from the street to help Mo and Rata organise the activities, which include nutritious meals for the homeless, morning teas for folks on the street, rehousing victims of domestic violence and the homeless, and assisting others facing challenging circumstances. Their philosophy is to be available for whoever

needs them, to help and listen, and do so without judgement whether their needs are medical, legal, protection of simply assistance in getting identification papers.

Over 200 individuals have been rehoused and many assisted with substance abuse rehabilitation, though not always successfully.

Currently they prepare a full meal for between 80 and 120 people on Monday evenings (beef stroganoff last week) and make available fresh produce, bread and groceries for those in need. On Thursday each week they make a nourishing breakfast and offer recycled clothing, household items, linen and personal effects, along with household bric-a-brac and furniture, at their open market inn the park at Bowen Hills.

Residents in Aveo have assisted these activities since early 2019 by collecting empty 10cent for recycling, gathering surplus items or furniture, appliances and clothing.
