#### ...contemplating the price of freedom

Gallipoli: The Scale of Our War is a ground-breaking exhibition on display at the Te Papa Museum in Wellington. It tells the story of the doomed eightmonth Gallipoli campaign in World War I through the eyes and words of eight ordinary New Zealanders.

2,779 Kiwis lost their lives on Gallipoli, with many others scarred forever.

Cutting-edge technology has been used to create 3-D maps and projections, miniatures, models, dioramas, and a range of interactive experiences that bring New Zealand's Gallipoli story to life, in a way that's never been seen before.






## **Camino Stage 3 - From Yvonne**

Anzac Speech

Tēnā koutou

I tipu ake au ki Rotorua, New Eealand, Aotearoa I raro i te maru o te maunga o Ngongotaha Engari i whãnau au i Hokitaika Kei te noho au ki Oamaru Ko Macrae te iwi Ko te tumuaki au i te kura o Maheno Ko Itella Macrae tōku ingoa Nō reira, tena koutou katoa

#### Hello to you all

I was raised in Rotorua, New Zealand after moving from Hokitika as a baby with my family. I now live in Oamaru, my home town of 10 years.

Four years ago I married my husband Rodie and became part of the Macrae family. I am currently the principal at Maheno School, a small rural school, 15 minutes drive South from the Oamaru township.

It is with fond memories I remember being present as you are now at the Anzac Service on Fraser Island. Such a fitting and special location for people to gather and remember those who sacrificed their way of life to go to war, in order to protect their homelands and futures from enemy take over. It is with deep sadness I acknowledge that for far too many it was in fact the ultimate sacrifice of life they made and then for those who were lucky enough to make it home it was often with PTSD lingering in their lives forever more as the knowledge and memories they endured stayed with them until the end. I also acknowledge those who have served either of our countries since, whether that was at home or directly in a growing list of conflicts since World War I.

It was back in 2019 that I stood there on the white sandy beach in front of the skeletal remains of the SS Maheno with a small group of very enthusiastic primary aged students from Maheho School, Oamaru, New Zealand. It was, at the time our third and final trip to K'gari (pronunced GUR-rie) to be present for the ANZAC commemorations and to ring the replica SS Maheno ship bell during the service. A very special honour indeed.

Here in New Zealand we always teach our students about the importance of ANZAC history and remembrance in the first term of school each year in preparation for ANZAC day on the 25th of April. We also always cover the importance of the relationships built between the Australian and New Zealand soldiers in desperate and dark times which for many included the realisation that war wasn't the great adventure that many of those young people were expecting. To have a comrade, a friend, of like minded backgrounds and life experiences was no doubt a very special thing for many of our 'boys'.

Every ANZAC day I always find myself reflecting about how these relationships continue today, just in different ways. We will always be so very grateful to the Brisbane High-Rise Rotary Club for their support in ensuring our students the opportunity to visit Australia and to be part of something that was of course much bigger than the ANZAC service itself and very much about continuing the ANZAC spirit of mate ship and comradery.

The students who came on the very first trip in 2015 bringing with them the original Maheno ship bell for casting are now young adults living their own lives after being enriched with all the experiences the trip bought to them as school students. Interestingly, in a fabulous twist of fate one of them is now my daughter-in-law to be and has recently given birth to my 4th grandchild much to my son's delight. I expect that their little boy, like his cousin will follow in our family tradition of being present at ANZAC services as he grows, thanks to my late father (a soldier himself) who instilled the importance of this to my sister's and I as we grew up in Rotorua.

Today, I will be attending two services with my husband, daughter and 4 year old granddaughter. The Dawn Service in Oamaru at 6:30am and then the Maheno Service at 9am at our local cenotaph. There too the Maheno Ship bell will be rung by one of our students, symbolising the ANZAC spirt of remembrance and friendship.

Both as the dawn breaks and then at the going down of the sun, we will remember them.
