No matter where you live, a clean water supply is essential to a healthy life. So, a large-scale Rotary project to supply clean water to Zimbabwean villages is bringing wideranging benefits.

Etelka Lehoczky published recently on Rotary International: "Nobody takes water for granted in Zimbabwe, least of all the residents of Musekiwa and Mushaki. Located about 160 kms from the capital of Harare, the two villages have been drastically affected by the country's water shortage."

Until Rotary intervened, many residents walked five kms or more daily to retrieve water from rivers and open wells. Often, they'd get there to find there was no water. Or the water they did find was contaminated. Read more about this life-changing Rotary initiative here.

Department of Transport and Main Roads explained how to make the new Queensland Digital Licence a friend.

"If you have a Queensland driver's licence, recreational marine licence, or a photo identification card, you can now safely and securely store it on your mobile device. Kellie said. Since it's the legal equivalent physical ID under Queensland law, you can use it to prove your identity, anywhere, at any time. And you don't need to wait until you get a new licence.


