Our Guest Speaker this week is **Dr Andrew Browning AM**, Medical Director of the Barbara May Foundation, based in Bowral, NSW.

The Barbara May Foundation (BMF) was founded in 2009 to support the work of Australian's Valerie Browning AM, and her nephew, Dr Andrew Browning AM in maternal healthcare in sub-Saharan Africa. They provide access to caring and knowledgeable maternal health professionals who treat all women with patience, respect and cultural sensitivity. The primary focus of BMF-funded programs is safer childbirth, the delivery of live babies, and mothers not dying or injured during childbirth.

Dr Browning will speak to us (via zoom) about **Maternity Africa** and **Care Packs for Destitute Mothers**, a
project our club is considering supporting:

Extremely destitute women constitute many of Maternity Africa's patients. On discharge, they face acute social and economic problems whilst caring for their new babies. Maternity Africa proposes providing small care packs for up to ten destitute mothers each month, and so help to relieve some of their immediate burdens.

Rotary medical camp benefits thousands:

Through the Rotary Family Health Days event 2024 held at Mzambarauni Primary School over a weekend in Dar es Salaam, more than 2500 citizens received free medical healthcare services and education.

The event was held as part of the continued efforts to support the government to bring healthcare services closer to citizens by conducting medical camps.

Health services provided included Malaria testing and preventive education, eye tests, dental check-ups, menstrual hygiene support, access to medication and specialist referrals as needed. Around 100 doctors including 50 general practitioners and 50 specialists comprising dentists, paediatricians and opticians as well as a team of approximately 500 volunteers participated in the provision of these services.
