The Viva! Vienna! Festival offers a master class in how a special event can galvanize residents and community groups, says Gunnar Spafford, a member of the Rotary Club of Vienna, Virginia, which took on the project in the mid-1990s.

The Memorial Day weekend event in a suburb of Washington, D.C., has grown into a huge celebration that attracted 60,000 people and raised USD 230,000 in 2013. 
