This, of course, is an area of care that this smart young woman has become quite familiar with here in Queensland, through her work experience at both CPL, Multicap and Mable.

But what had promised to be an uplifting and exciting experience working at the US camp was in fact, quite challenging. Zanthia was surprised when it became clear that (in lowa at least) people living with disabilities receive a considerably lower level of personcentric care and have less access to the equipment they need than compared to Australia. Zanthia learnt a lot about herself and is grateful for the systems we have in Australia.




We have now secured as our Guest Speaker Super Coach Wayne Bennett AM.


