FROM THE PRESIDENT - DYLYS BERTELSEN

... transporting sick children

Telling their story to an avid breakfast audience last week were COO Katie McIntyre and Base Manager Kathie Stoker from the children's charity Little Wings. This is a nonprofit organization that provides free medical flights and ground transport to seriously ill children and their families from rural and regional locations across NSW, ACT and Queensland.

This amazing little organisation first began by providing transport to children undergoing cancer treatment at The Children's Hospital in Westmead, Sydney. Since then, it has extended its services to include other seriously ill kids – regardless of diagnosis - at another four other hospitals including Queensland Children's.

As explained by Kathie and Katie "We strive to ease the journey and help sick children access the specialised medical services and treatments that are only available in major cities or towns." As part of that process, Little Wings "does everything it can to support families by easing the financial burden, emotional strain and travel fatigue associated with standard long-distance travel to seek vital medical treatment."

Appreciating the impact that serious and chronic illness has on children and their loved ones, Little Wings works to keep families together during these testing times. Sometimes that involves travel to regular appointments. Or it can mean giving kids who have been hospitalised a chance to come home for some needed quality time with family and friends.

...preventing illness in 100,000 kids

The island countries of the South Pacific are tropically warm, economically diverse, and really far apart. In this region, which spans millions of square miles, even individual countries' islands are scattered across vast distances.

Public health workers face unique challenges in vaccinating the islands' children.

"It's hard to transport vaccines to the outer islands because of the distance and transport availability," says Rufina Tutai, who oversees immunizations for the Cook Islands. The 15 islands in her jurisdiction are spread over nearly 2 million square kms. (770,000 square miles).

Such obstacles didn't deter the Rotarians of Australia, New Zealand, and several Pacific Island countries from organizing a major vaccination program in the islands. Called Give Every Child a Future, the effort – which celebrates 100 years of Rotary in the region – is providing three new vaccines to 100,000 children in nine Pacific Island groups: the Cook Islands, Kiribati, Nauru, Niue, Samoa, Tokelau, Tonga, Tuvalu, and Vanuatu.
