The Rotary Club of Dombivli Midtown, in collaboration with Bhakti Vedant Hospital and Vishwasamarpan, conducted a Free Eye Check-Up and Cataract Surgery Camp to provide essential eye care services to the underprivileged.

The camp saw over 500 participants receiving comprehensive eye examinations from skilled professionals, identifying common issues such as refractive errors, glaucoma, and cataracts.

Participants were also educated on the importance of regular eye check-ups to prevent long-term vision issues. Approximately 140 individuals diagnosed with cataracts were recommended for surgery, and free cataract operations were provided, restoring vision and improving their quality of life.
