Last Week— Vere Gray

When Vere Gray was a member of Batemans Bay Rota-

ry, she was involved in the organisation and management of two Global Grant projects undertaken with sister club RC Intramuros, Manila, Philippines.

The first Global Grant project built 25 twin toilets in two remote villages. On the recommendation of the local priest, who had seen Rotary's success building toilets in another village he told them "This is Rotary, they won't let you down".



After eighteen months of challenges with road access, transport of supplies, communications, typhoon disruptions and the need to cross twenty rivers, over 500 beneficiaries were very pleased to have toilets which not only changed their habits but improved their lives as well. Vere and another Rotarian were able to visit for the official Turn Over ceremonies in February 2020.

A second Global Grant project built a gravity fed water system and 10 single toilets in two other villages. The project which was started before the pandemic, was delayed by many Covid disruptions and restrictions, but was finally completed in March 2022, with over 1000 beneficiaries.

Moruya Rotary donated \$1000 towards both these Global Grant projects. Several other Rotary clubs plus our Rotary district and D3820 in the Philippines donated funds, as well as The Rotary Foundation, under whose guidelines the projects were constructed.

Batemans Bay Rotary is no longer supporting RC Intramuros projects. However, RC Intramuros is grateful to Moruya Rotary for responding their request to help a remote school by the rebuilding of a water system which was irreparably damaged by a typhoon last year. The project will also provide drinking water for the children. We are going to apply for a District Grant to help fund this project.
