John Hayes—a great sendoff

It was a great tribute to John's popularity and his interest in volunteering that the Catholic Church was almost full.

Family eulogies outlined the mixed fortunes of a full and interesting life. For many years John was a traveller, selling window furnishings—a job which earned him a *Salesman of the Year* award in 1968. Then they moved to Canberra to join a new firm selling Venetian blinds.

In 1965 he married Mary, the mother of his four sons. She died in 2007, leaving him desolate. But then he met Shirl and a whole new life opened for him.

Together they went to the Kalumburu Catholic Mission, to Kenya, Cambodia, Nepal, Timor Leste, the Philippines, Papua New Guinea and finally the Moruya Stall at the International Hamburg Rotary Convention. The ties to Rotary projects strengthened particularly through RAWCS and the development of Shirl's SHEP project. In all the projects, John was an active partner.

In her "Farewell to John" segment Shirl writes "John was a social dynamo, friend of the disadvantaged, charity worker, organizer of happy hours, and communicator with rich and poor, black and white. I am very grateful for my thirteen years with John."

Our Guard of Honour, as the four stalwart sons brought out the coffin on its way to burial in Moruya cemetery, made a fitting end to the service.






Last Week—Dr Dianne McInnes

Coupled with her extraordinary output as a writer is ability as a researcher which enhanced her academic career, culminating in her Doctorate from Bond University in 2016. The Tamworth Institution for Boys was one of the harshest in Australia. Dianne's thesis "Degraded identities: an analysis of the long-term psychological, physical and criminogenic effects of institutional trauma in a detention centre for adolescent males" covered 250 pages.

So how to sum up on this talented woman: writer, researcher, criminologist—to which we should add after dinner speaker, story teller and humourist.
