PETS Training and Learning Development at Merimbula.

It was very poignant when Past Rotary International Director and captivating speaker Noel Trevaskis talked of his experience with depression. He said, "Rotary gave me a purpose in life ... sharing my story at clubs was a healing story." He had gentle advice, "Do what you can when you can ... Have a social night on a different night ... you must have a purpose ... members want friendship and community service not sausages service ... many new members leave within two years as clubs are not giving friendship to new members."

Youth Protection was a subject at the Merimbula conference. It is a complex area, which Sue Proud handled in her years as Protection Officer, in which she made sure that those of us who were likely to have anything to do with children (defined as under the age of 18) had the necessary clearances under the Working with Children Check. These checks are valid for five years. Since 2019, a Volunteer Declaration is required for anyone who is alone with one person under 18. This is particularly relevant if taking a young person home in a car but applies in all other situations. At the Conference the presenter made the point that if a Rotarian is talking to a group or two or more young people he or she is classified as a Responsible Adult and only needs a Working With Children Check (WWCC). However if alone with a person under 18 he/she is considered a Volunteer and also needs the Volunteer Declaration. (I can't find any back up for Shirley's note on this point—perhaps after District Changeover we should investigate further? Editor.)
