An example of the forceful **Breakout Sessions** I attended was **Project Rozana** This forum of one Muslim, a Christian (Tim Costello) and a Jew featured Project Rozana which 'transports Palestinian patients to hospitals within Israeli borders, and providing treatment options for Palestinians where access to specialist and/or quality healthcare is limited.' It enables cooperation between Israelis and Palestinians within health on the personal level so, 'Palestinians and Israelis coexist peacefully, with a sense of mutual respect, dignity and safety for all.'

Pakistan report on Polio Plus – revealed the sad and tragic cost of polio vaccination - 64 of its brave front line workers died - many from gunshot wounds.

Singapore 2024 Convention is a short flight and in a gastro-nomic paradise on 25-29 May. As I came from registering a TV crew gave me a 5 minute interview about why I wanted to go. Maybe you will see a snip of it in the advertising?
