Last Week—Broulee Brewhouse

David Quinton was educated in Moruya but when he left High School, there were few local jobs available, and he moved to Sydney.

From a start in the kitchen of a Fine Arts centre, hemoved through a series of catering experiences, becoming a chef in a variety of restaurants, particularly in pub bistros. A new experience took him to a warehouse specializing in kitchen equipment. This variety of work led to his conclusion that in the business of catering for a wide variety of customers, people skills are more important than cooking skills.

Covid led to a break in his employment and brought him back to Broulee, where his brother Rodney and Rodney's friend Mark were planning a break into the brewing business. Their requirement was for land with security of tenure and space to grow and they were lucky to find 71 Coronation Drive.

A job lot of brewing equipment from Milton gave them a start, but soon bigger tanks and machines were needed. Part of the charm of the brewery is that so much of the building and surrounds—individual tables and chairs, with or without canopies—are evidence of amateur craftsmen and workingbees. Betty, an 1947 Bedford, can work alongside to supplement or replace the kitchen.

So from the official opening in December 2021, the business has grown and grown—full time brewers and chef, up to 30 part timers. Periodic visits from a commercial canning machine extend the catalogue. Planned involvement and support for local community events help to establish the brewery as a Broulee stalwart.

International project in the Philippines

We were asked to work with the Rotary Club of Intramuros, Philippines in funding the rehabilitation (essentially rebuilding) of a drinking fountain station, in a country school at Laguana. Vere Gray has supported this area for several years. The total cost is estimated to be over US\$4,000. The Board agreed that we would donate US\$1,000 and (subject to advice from PDG Phil) apply for a District Grant. Thus total funding could come from two districts and two clubs. Vere will be the driver of this project.
