The Club continues to be responsible for the movements of the Life Education mobile classroom in the Eurobodalla each year.

We have a team of drivers, Jeff Proud, John Gillett, Col Jay, Rohan and this year Peter Smith joined in. Jerry was a driver and we will miss his skills and expertise. Pauline and John Nader did the chaperone duties in 2022 to move the drivers back and forth to the various schools.

We collected the truck and mobile classroom at Tilba on 12th October. We had setups at Narooma Public, Bodalla Public and finally Broulee Primary Schools.

Not a big year with a number of late school cancellations and I thank Marshall's Bus Company for their continued support and security storage. Steve Munday performed brake and camera maintenance when the rig was at Bodalla. Our final move back to the Bega team was during the last weekend in November. It will see service in the Bega Valley before heading up the mountain to Snowy Mountains Shire for Term 1 2023

We used the rig as a cool room for drinks for the firefighters during the bushfires and Covid has made rolling out the program with the schools over the past three years difficult but finally this year the program was much more stable, and we look forward to a healthy 2023 program from Tilba to Batemans Bay. The new secondary school program is likely to be offered in 2023

Andrew the CEO of Life Education' NSW has offered to address the Club in thanks for the many years of dedicated service and fund raising which goes back to the 1970's and we need to acknowledge John Nader's input into this program in those years.

It would be ideal to have the mobile classroom in town for Andrew's visit so the Club could see the new fully digital presentation which has evolved over recent years and hopefully Andrew's presentation can be part of our Club's program in 2023.
