Treasurer—No volunteer as yet

There is probably a feeling that the job of a Treasurer is so complex that accounting qualifications are needed. This is not so, though it is easy to see how that view arises. In the six years of his treasurership, Rohan used his own proprietorial software which could produce monthly detailed reports of up to 13 pages.

As incoming club treasurer, you would not be using that software. However the job is more complex than that of the treasurer of say the Rural Fire Service, or Probus. It has to deal with subscriptions to RI or the Foundation, with money to or from District and of course with the dues of individual members.

In the days when our Treasurers served for only one or two years, we relied on District assembly training sessions to teach the rules. And, indeed, our present District manual says "Districts also hold role-based training events for club presidents, secretaries, treasurers, and committee chairs"

But even if our District mounts old style training assemblies in 2022/23 year, it is too late for us. Perhaps we could find out how Batemans Bay and Narooma are coping and follow their leads. However we do it, we must have a Treasurer.
