Janice Sagar of Moruya Bookshop was sick and, with only a couple of hours to prepare, Greg agreed to fill the gap.

In introducing Greg, John Gillette was able to run through a long list of Greg's enterprises and achievements, many in community work. It was the latter, mainly his work with Yumaro, which led to his OAM in 2020.

It was his involvement with Rugby Union and a strong sense of adventure which took him to Swazi-

land for four years in the mid 1970s. The landlocked kingdom was working through the post British colonial years—exciting but unsafe.

Horse rides took him from north to south, then east to west through national parks and game reserves On one horseback expedition his party was attacked by native warriors, leaving him with a near severed eyelid which he stitched back on place until a nurse at a remote station did a more professional repair. He found time to establish a newspaper, at its peak employing four staff. He visited Natal and Botswana where he made friends with the family of Seretse Khama, the one time President.

But the most enduring result of his African adventure was a wife. Forty four years later Corrinne is still his support in all his ventures.

Greg was a Rotarian for a decade before resigning in October 2000. He did a year as Bulletin Editor.
