Batemans Bay Rotary reports a success Beginning in 2012, the club has pressured Council to clean up the Observation Point lookout at Batehaven.

Rotary funds were allocated and after much frustration, the club agreed that those funds should be used to provide a stairway from Corrigans Beach to Observation Point. This stairway Was completed in 2019.

Meanwhile, the Shire was able to access significant funds from State and Commonwealth Government to upgrade the road to the point and equip the vewing area wth ramps and seating. The project finally opened on Christmas Eve 2022. The total cost of the Observation Point upgrade and walking trail combined will be around \$6.5m.
