RACE DAY COMMITTEE

In the past seven years a joint three Rotary Club project (Batemans Bay, Moruya and Narooma) and the Moruya Jockey Club has raised over \$170,000 for our local community, each year with a special project:

- supporting the establishment of the Oncology
 Ward at the Moruya hospital
- 2) providing much needed equipment for our Surf Life Saving Clubs
- installing twelve defibrillators (AEDs) in locations across the shire
- providing funds to Muddy Puddles who provide essential support to our young children with disabilities
- as a major contributor towards the Yumaro/ Eurobodalla Meals on Wheels people mover.

Due to Covid-19 restrictions the event was not held in 2020.

Since August 2021 the money has been raised with the aim that it will buy a Palliative Care Car for the Eurobodalla Community Health Palliative Care Service for its nurses to visit patients and those in need.

Recently it has been found that to quote David Ashford "Unfortunately we have hit a major problem about the ownership and use of the vehicle. The nurses are now supplied with State Fleet cars and are not permitted to drive any other cars. So if we donate a vehicle the nurses will most likely not be able to use it. Also the Rotary Club would be responsible for the cars ongoing costs." This means that the car is not practical.

On the 14th of December 2022 a meeting of the Race Day Committee decided that the money donated would be returned to the donors. Moruya Rotary's contribution was \$3000. This was from profits from the canteen on Race Day Meetings. Our board will decide who to donate this money too. The CAERH Carers Accommodation Eurobodalla Regional Hospital has been suggested.

The Race Day Committee will meet before the Easter races next year to discuss further projects.

Trachoma Project.

The only serious business at our Christmas Party was a presentation by Jan and Sue of the Trachoma Project, which the Friends of Rotary are working on. They are providing 15 kits that are family sized (two adults and two children) plus two extra family sized bags for two teachers and their families and three children only bags for families with extra kids.

Moruya is partnered with Rotary Frankston North and another club not yet named. All three will complete their bags then a delivery will be organized to Ampilatwatja (pronounced um-bludder-witch) which is the largest of three communities under the Aherrenge Aboriginal Association. The language spoken at the community is Alyawarr and there are up to 650 residents. It is located four hours drive north of Alice Springs. The road is sealed for 100km and unsealed for 220 km.

As soon as there is a completion date It would be a wonderful opportunity for Rotary Moruya members to personally deliver the bags Let Sue or Jan know if you would be interested.
