This was in contrast to the audience which were about two thirds men. Five of the Youth Exchange students were women and there was one tall lean male from Finland.

After Saturday dinner I was mesmerised by **Mitch Tambo** who performed in Eurovision *Australia Decides*. His music mixture of traditional First Nations rhythm, modern technology and emotional themes. This resulted in music everyone understood and he soon had the dance floor filled, then overflowing. A very special experience.

Later the **Youth Exchangers kept the rhythm** going with the Nutbush and diverse modern movement.

Our Skydive meeting

Thanks go to Pauline who organized this meeting and even bigger thanks to Jan who fed the 24 of us with a beef and potato bake and various salads, all gluten free and very tasty.

Jules McConnel first spoke to us about Skydiving in October 2011. At that stage she was already well known in sky diving circles and had taken part in international events, including a multiple formation of 400 parachutes. Last year she was awarded an OAM for her services to skydiving.

In the decade since that talk, Skydive Oz has gone from strength to strength. The owner, Paul Smith, has built the magnificent hangar which houses his planes. He also has the accommodation units beside the hanger.

Prices and duration of a diving experience rise as the plane flies higher, so that for example a tandem jump from 10,000 feet (a good Christmas gift?) is \$348; at 15,000 ft it is \$398.00.

But that is just the basic. A variety of diving experiences are on offer, some leading to internationally recognised licences. Backing up these residential courses are three standards of overnight accommodation in the Skydive Oz cabins.

One tremendous advantage that Moruya Skydive Oz enjoys is the nearness of the beach for planned landings. Having shooed any beachgoers from the landing space, a sandy touchdown should be relatively soft.

Local History: The Great Tollway Project

In the late 1980s, Leigh Day, a past District Governor, transferred to our Club and was soon recognized as a man of vision. It was he who in in 1981 prepared a detailed paper on the possibilities of a tollway between Queanbeyan and Mogo. The plan received good support at a number of levels, particularly by the Chamber of Commerce.

Rohan Gleeson was the Secretary of the Chamber for 22 years. However the cache of tollway documents, including the Rotary paper, disappeared from both Rotary and Chamber records.

The late Eric Wiseman, Editor of the *Southern Star*, had obviously been very interested in the proposal and it was amongst his files that copies of the missing papers were found— over 90 pages.

Rohan has scanned and digitized the collection and sealed the originals. There is material there for historical researchers in the future.

Meanwhile, we live with Clyde Mountain.
