* Not finally decided. It has been proposed that we have a number of members who can volunteer for this role and for one to be rostered on for each meeting. This member would be made aware of the purchases for the day, have a copy of the staffing roster and generally oversee any freezing of leftover food and final cleaning and lock up. It is a full day so rotating the job would be fairer to all concerned.

From Jan Young, addressing the problem of kiosk supervision.

For a few weeks now I have been wracking my brain (not a big job) to try and find a reason why members were not keen to take on the managing of the kiosk. I came to the conclusion that long term commitment was the problem. By asking people to oversee just a couple of meetings a year solves this problem. I suggest a 'duty' manager for each meeting who is prepared to stay all day or be deputised by another. This person would be aware of purchases for the day, have a copy of the staffing roster and generally oversee any freezing of food and final cleaning and locking up.

I feel that this is a good plan to go forward with and along with our usual Rotary co operation it will allow us to continue to run the kiosk into the future

From Ward, accepting Jan's suggestion...

There seems to be agreement to Jan's suggestion for a monthly (maybe 2 months?) duty manager. This spreads the workload and provides flexibility if someone goes down. John Spencer taking on the Roster so that Tony could assume the planning aspects, plus more delegation seems to have been the keys to establishing a fairer workable system.

Steve will be in charge for January and he has all the experience needed to start this off. What we need is for a number of volunteers for duty manager and one to understudy Steve in January (Andrew?) and then someone to understudy Andrew and so on during the year.

And a final note on our opposition, an extract from the Jockey Club website.
