We had no guest speaker and our Acting President Sue (who showed remarkable skill in that position) called on Andrew to give a summary of the Elek's recent travels to Norway, Scotland, Devon and Spain.

Andrew had planned the journey in detail and made all relevant bookings. However the parlous state of the airline industry, not just Qantas as highlighted in last week's *Four Corners*, quickly wrecked his schedule, leading to delays, cancellations and the substitution of long bus journeys. Not least among these problems was that a case of Jane's was lost among the shambles of baggage handling and took six days to reappear. The only airline which emerged with credit is Rex between Sydney and Moruya.

They started off in Oslo, Norway, then a cruise northwards to Tromso past magnificent fiords and glaciated mountains.

Andrew is much impressed by Norway's handling of its riches coming from North Sea oil and gas. Not only does this fund social services and health, but substantial amounts are invested in the Government's Sovereign Wealth Fund for the benefit of future generations.

To England to catch up with a daughter and two grandsons, now aged nine and fourteen, the latter showing evidence of a keen analytical mind.\*
