David and Rachael McInnes on Geophysics

David is a Narooma Rotarian. He presented his highly technical subject with tremendous enthusiasm and a comprehensive collection of images, mostly illustrating the diverse geology of Australia and its history as a very ancient land.

Ground penetrating radar is the main instrument of research, and now the whole of our continent has been scanned by airborne GPR. From the results the skilled geophysicist can detect where various metals are likely to be found.

As we move away from fossil fuels this knowledge becomes crucial. Lithium, nickel, cobalt, manganese and graphite are involved in battery performance. Of these, lithium is currently the key. It exists in quantity in Australia and is mined mainly in West Australia. However the mined mineral needs extensive and complex treatment before it can be used in batteries. As of now there is no method of recycling lithium batteries, leading to David's view that in ten years time, lithium will be the new asbestos, shunned by all.
