Resolutions to Change Rotary

As an individual Rotarian you can change the the way Rotary International or the Rotary Foundation work. You frame a resolution which if your club supports will go to District who will refer it to its Council on Resolution Representative, in our case PDG Peter Ford. That Council meets on line each year and from its deliberations come the items which are considered by the Council on Legislation, which meets every three years to make resolutions which go to RI and/or the Foundation which can result in changes to the Constitutions of RI, Districts and Clubs.

The next Council on Legislation meets in 2025. Last week Peter Ford sent us the list of the Resolutions as it stands at present, and we were given the opportunity (though not much time) to comment. It is worthwhile scanning the list, mentally dividing those you support and those you do not. For instance a resolution from Canada proposes that mental problems should not prevent youths taking part in the Youth Exchange Program!

Then there is RESOLUTION 23R-16 which is a request from the Rotary Club of Osaka that the RI Board consider encouraging Rotary activities in the metaverse "WHEREAS, the metaverse, which is constantly advancing, has given rise to cyber universes that reproduce the physical world in great detail through avatars, and this holds the potential to increase Rotary's philanthropic activities both in quantity and in quality. The youth of Generation Z, or those between the ages of 11 and 26, are quite naturally well acquainted with this new technology and might potentially be attracted to Rotary activities undertaken on such a platform, such as the metaverse..... that the Board of Directors of Rotary International consider encouraging Rotary activities in the metaverse."
