#### **Derek's Dissertations**

We are fast approaching Rotary's 119<sup>th</sup> birthday, with Rotary founded on the 23<sup>rd</sup> February 1905. In those early days, I doubt whether Paul Harris and his fellow Rotarians would have dreamed the organisation would become what it is today, with 1.4 million Rotarians, over 46,000 clubs in over 200 countries.

RI President in 1916/17, Arch Klumph established the Rotary Endowment principle: "Carrying on, as we are, a miscellaneous community service, it seems eminently proper that we should accept endowments for the purpose of doing good in the world, in charitable, educational or other avenues of community progress, or such funds could be well used for extension work." After this Endowment Fund was initially established at the International Convention in 1917, it became The Rotary Foundation in 1928. Last year, our Foundation raised over US \$427 million and funded more than 1,100 global grants, 470 district grants, and 310 disaster response grants to help communities thrive. The Rotary Foundation is OUR charity of choice, and as such we should, and DO support our Foundation.

Last week we again enjoyed the hospitality of Sue & Jeff Proud. Again, thanks to all who provided salads or desserts, and special thanks goes to Jan Young for her scrumptious individual lemon merangues. This was the last of our summer BBQs, and so this week we return to the MGC for our normal regular weekly meetings. I look forward to seeing you all back at MGC for fun, fellowship, and Rotary project planning.

Thursday morning, Chris Manahan, Allan Shephard, John Sewell, and I went to the heritage cemetery at Toragy Point. We were met by Daniel from NSWNP who has been working with Chris on the cemetery reparation project. Accompanying Daniel were three more NSWNP rangers who will be taking over the management of the cemetery. Daniel outlined the two headstones that need to be moved and two that need to be lifted up, plus the two gravesites requiring work on the surrounding fences. Chris has more details on the work required. We are very much limited by heritage requirements, but working within those limitations we can enhance this historic cemetery.

#### Helen KOP - 2024 Moruya Citizen of the Year

For the past fifteen years, Helen KOP has performed the role of 'Advocate' for returned servicemen and women. This is a voluntary role and Helen donates countless hours of her time into supporting veterans .... helping them to attain their entitlements and benefits.

Helen's work as an 'Advocate' for veterans largely goes unnoticed. It is a role which the 'civilian' community is likely very unfamiliar ..... and the work of an Advocate is rarely, if ever, placed in the public eye.

Relentlessly, Helen KOP donates her time and knowledge as a proud volunteer, to improve the health and lifestyle of Veterans from the Shoalhaven in the north, through to the Victorian border. In fact, she is the only person who is performing this demanding role and as such, Helen is currently juggling around 130 + cases. This quantity is far in excess of her quota. Further to this, we have been made aware that Helen has offered support to some Veterans located Interstate who have nobody else to turn to for help.

Only the veterans themselves, and perhaps their immediate family will truly know the amount of work that Helen has quietly performed in the background of our community.

If that is not enough, Helen also volunteers her time in support of local, not for profit organisations who cry out for help. Helen even stepped in at very short notice last month to assist the Lion's Club when they desperately needed assistance at the Moruya Carols By Candlelight.

#### Mackenzie BARNETT-HAYES – 2024 Moruya Junior Citizen of the Year

Mackenzie BARNETT-HAYES is a recent school leaver and has entered the local work force. Whilst most of you will not know her name, you may recognise her face if you have attended any of the commemorative ANZAC Day services within the Eurobodalla over the past three years.

Mackenzie was nominated by the Tuross Memorial Gardens Committee, based on her commitment shown in support of the RSL movement since 2021. 'Macca' as she is known, is one of the fine young people who has performed the role of Catafalque Party at our many services each ANZAC DAY.

To give you an idea of her commitment, Macca starts her day at 3.30am and performs catafalque duty at the Tuross Dawn Service. She then travels as fast as the legal speed limit will allow, to be in time for the Tomakin morning service. Macca would then attend the Moruya main service, finally finishing her day at the Moruya Dusk Service at the World War 2 bunkers near Moruya airport. A record four services every ANZAC Day.

Further to this, young Macca was a supporter and active participant in the 2022 and 2023 Moruya Mardi Gras Street parades, when young people were desperately needed. She is always the first to step forward and volunteer for community events, bringing other youngsters with her.

The Tuross Garden Committee states that Macca possesses the rare traits of Reliability and Dependability and consider her a shining example of Australian Youth ..... and future leader in our community. Macca will be there again this coming ANZAC Day and has volunteered to train up any future youth who wish to step up to the challenge.
