

Regionalisation

There at present 527 Districts in RI. The plan is that they could be replaced by , say, 20 to 40 regions. We are in one of the zones selected to pilot the change. As President Derek explains, he, Secretary Vere and Steve Picton have begun the study of the plan and Steve is to outline what is involved in his talk at our meeting on 17 October.

Inherent in the plan is the ability of Clubs to get together with other clubs to form Community Groups. There are Primary Community Groups and Secondary Community Groups. Once we see the advantages, presumably we would (with their agreement), join with Batemans Bay and Narooma to form a Primary Group. The end of October is suggested as the time for the groups to be formed.
