We now know the date for the upcoming referendum for Australians to consider whether to vote "Yes" or "No" to alter the Constitution, proposing to give Australia's Indigenous peoples a right to give advice only on government policies concerning them, and to recognize Australia's Indigenous peoples as the First People of Australia.

Regardless of how you intend to vote, I would hope that you will do so in a considered and well-informed way regarding the humanity of this decision. Unfortunately, this process has been heavily politicized rather than being debated only on the human side of the argument.

As I write this, I have just returned home from attending Graham Thomas's funeral. As you would expect, it was well attended. Rotarians and ex-defence personnel formed a Guard of Honour as his casket was carried into the chapel. Grahm's brother Warwick is an ordained priest and conducted the service. At the conclusion, Moruya RSL Sub-Branch conducted a moving memorial to his Naval Service after which nearly everyone there placed poppies on his casket. A gathering was held after at the MJC Members Lounge, and I informed Lorne that if she has anything that requires to be attended to where we can help, to let us know, and she was thankful for that offer.

Domestic violence is not new—there have always been bullying husbands and fathers, secure as wage earners and, in the

not so recent past, in the promise of the bride that she would love, honour and **obey.** Today such men are frustrated and the law is firmly on the woman's side, to the extent that last year there was legislation to ban 'coercive control', the master and servant relationship which often precedes actual physical violence.

Too often physical violence leads to the wife taking the children and seeking refuge. Jacquie told of the "Safer in the Home" program where the wife will stay in her home which is equipped with locks and cameras and a direct phone line to police should the offending male gain or threaten entrance.

Jacquie showed two videos, the first identifying by drawings and graphs situations in which male domination led to violence and persecutions. The second showed a young husband being abused by his wife to illustrate that in almost a third of domestic violence cases, the victim is male.

Do men who as children who grew up in a violent home turn to violence in their adult relationships? Jacquie says the statistics are unclear.
