She then began a career centred on the humanites. This took her to work in King County, Washington, to Vietnam, to the Federal Government in Canberra then to the ACT Government and, on moving to the coast, the Shire Council.

She joined Arts Central in that prominent and now quite old building in Riverside Park. In its heyday Georgina Parsons (Auntie Coop) worked there with the Historical Society to preserve Aboriginal Stories and Legends.

However Covid lockdowns virtually closed the organisation, so that Mandy could join a new team, intent on new programs under new management.

Work began on a general clear out and re-arrangement of the interior. Discarded stuff was moved to the space underneath the building and Mandy's plea was that Rotary would help to clear it.
