

The Rotary Club of New York was established in 1909. It provides civic-minded business and professional men and women with an enjoyable and organised way to make a contribution to the city of New York and to needy areas of the world. The Club is part of Rotary District 7230.

Known as the 'Host Club of America' the Rotary Club of New York has over 200 members.

The Club meets on a Thursday, alternating between an evening and lunch meeting at a variety of locations, to plan club, community and international service activities. The 2023 – 2024 President is Julie Gallanty.

The Rotary Club of New York holds an enjoyable and friendship building monthly breakfast meeting with United Nations Directors, Administrators and Ambassadors. Every year the Club helps host 1,500 Rotarians to attend 'Rotary Day at the United Nations' – it is normally held in the first week of November.

Some of the activities of the Club this year have been – the Italian Evening – a great night of Italian dishes to feast upon whilst raising funds for Earthquake Relief; support for UNICEF for the 'world strategy to combat malaria, leaving no one behind'; a joint meeting via Zoom with the Rotary Club of Kiev to show support for Rotary in the Ukraine; help put together individual school bags for school students of various age groups in Manhattan – markers, pencils, folders, books, etc.; The New York Rotary Foundation supports more than 24 organisations including the Salvation Army, YM and YWCA, Boy Scouts, Columbia Presbyterian Medical Centre, Madison Square Boys and Girls Club, Saint Agnes Soup Kitchen, Horizon Concerts, National Association for Visually Handicapped, Police and Firemen's Recognition Day and Polio Pus.

Guest Speaker - DG Paul Roger

- DG Paul has visited approx. 30 clubs + changeovers so far this year.
 Will be visiting club until May next year. There are 115 to visit! 9620 is one of the largest districts in the world. There are currently 1.4million Rotarians in the world
- RI President Gordon McInally wants clubs to keep doing the great things that they do
- Rotary is all about 'service above self' eg Polio eradication, Flooding in Lybia, Moroccan earthquake, Ukraine aid we raise funds around the world. The Rotary Foundation channels money so well
- Rotary Foundation has contributed over \$8 billion of help around the world.
- Our district should be so proud of the eradication of Polio. In 1987 RI President Clem Renouf (from RC of Nambour) started the End Polio campaign
- There are so many stories of how Rotarians have had ideas too big for their club, but have been taken up around the world eg shelterbox, End Polio
- Theme for the year is Create Hope in the World. We can make this
 happen locally & internationally. Our clubs' projects like Rotary Park development, Mental Health support, RYDA, the Suitcase club + more are good local examples
- Rotary needs to stay relevant & competitive must learn to adapt. There is much competition these days
- How can we continue to make our club as relevant as it has been? Be more visible, attract younger members, bring in new members. Change happens in small increments (marginal gains). How can we do this here? The DG highlighted the British Cycling team's success as a good example
- RI President's Goal is about togetherness how together we see a vision to create change. DG wants clubs in district to work together to develop great ideas, big ideas. More power, more people more thinking
- 2 District 9620 campaigns this year (following RI President's theme) say NO to Family Domestic Violence + Eliminating the Stigma of Mental Health issues. Respectful Relationships campaign in Ballina is a great idea. DG wants people in all areas to join the campaign. Clubs can order shirts + poster, ban
 - ners on line. District committee in place & Chair is Eric Wood. Fortnight of actions will be run across the district in November. The challenge is for all district clubs to join
- Annual 9620 Conference lasts year 600 attended. Next year's conference theme is "Unlocking Our Potential" & will be held 8-10 March at Sea World 2024
- <u>DG's Partner's project</u> Shelterbox program. Please donate. There are 113 million homeless people in world due to disasters
