RAGAS HAS ESTABLISHED AN AWARDS PROGRAM TO RECOGNIZE INDIVIDUALS GLOBALLY FOR THEIR GREAT IMPACT ON FIGHTING HUMAN TRAFFICKING & MODERN SLAVERY

The first-ever awardee to be nominated and selected for a RAGAS award is Karen Walkowsi. On January 13th, 2022 Dave McCleary, chair of the RAGAS board, presented the "Rotarian Inspiring Hope Award" virtually (during her club zoom meeting) to Karen Walkowski. The award shines a light on Rotarians such as Karen, who have had made a tangible impact on human trafficking/modern slavery. It is also an opportunity for the global Rotary movement to take inspiration and encouragement from what Karen and other Rotarians have accomplished.

Know anyone looking for a summer internship in the non-profit field? RCEHT is on the lookout for talented, mission-driven college students/youth who are ready to make an impact on the world and help us achieve our Rotary mission to end human slavery.

Overview:

This position will work with several key members on the club's Communications Team and Board of Directors. There will be lots of opportunity for collaboration and mentorship. The internship is a remote position, requiring around 5-10 hours per week. The role will provide a broad range of exposure across PR, Marketing, Social Media, Content Creation & Strategy, and Graphic Design. Due to the nature of Rotary as a non-profit/volunteer organization, this is an unpaid position. The internship can be used for academic credit at your institution.

The ideal candidate is passionate about gaining new marketing/PR skills and experiences, possesses strong writing skills, is well organized and motivated, and is able to quickly adjust and balance multiple priorities. The candidate is also passionate about non-profit leadership specifically humanitarian issues like ending human trafficking.

Key Responsibilities:

- Work as part of club's growing communications and PR team to build out marketing and communications strategy
- Assist with campaign creation, development, execution and reporting
- Create social media content for Facebook, LinkedIn, and Youtube, and club website
- Assist with writing, editing, and designing monthly newsletter

- Students currently studying Marketing, Communications, Journalism, Design, or similar discipline (Junior-Senior year preferred)
- Passion for non-profit work that creates global impact
- Strong writer and communicator
- Experience working with graphic design tools (Illustrator, Photoshop, Canva, etc)
- Proficient in social media with demonstrated interest in brand messaging, copywriting, or content creation
- Ability to work independently to deliver high-quality results on time
- Comfortable with ambiguity and taking on projects without clear solutions
