




PRESIDENT'S LETTER

Rotarians Empower Students to Help End Child Trafficking "Not One More Victim"

It was announced today that the Rotary Club of North Jacksonville received a grant of \$1000.00 from the Rotary Action Group Against Slavery ("RAGAS"). North Jacksonville President-Elect, Denny Winkelman, along with Madison Edwards, a former Interact Club and National Honor Society Student Leader who graduated from First Coast High School and who is now an intern working during the summer of 2023 as an anti-human trafficking advocate, submitted the grant request during June 2023. Per Winkelman: "our North Jacksonville Florida Rotarians are highly focused on creating a world where every child is safe-and-free from exploitation".

Rotarian Members in a multitude of clubs worldwide are firmly committed to this very high-impact initiative. It is specifically designed as a high-profile awareness and outreach project to educate and train groups of students at both high schools and colleges to detect, defend and disrupt predators in their own environment and to stop the scourge of child trafficking.

The grant will be used in Florida to further the training already underway at the First Coast High School and to expand this project to high schools throughout Northeast Florida. Using the Partners Against Child Trafficking online, multi-media SACT training-program automation (Students Against Child Trafficking), North Jacksonville Rotarians, under the leadership of its President Tom Meissgeier, a retired US Army Special Forces Lieutenant Colonel, believe this project will have a very significant and lasting community impact in the protection of our vulnerable youth. Pat Mulvihill, one of the North Jacksonville Club Leaders "thanks RAGAS for this grant to empower young leaders combat child trafficking and help eradicate modern human slavery".

About Our Family of Rotary: The North Jacksonville Family of Rotary is part of a global network of volunteer leaders dedicated to tackling the world's most pressing humanitarian challenges. Rotary connects 1.4 million members of more than 46,000 Rotary clubs in almost every country in the world. Their work improves lives at both the local and international








A movie about human trafficking came out on July 4th called the "Sound of Freedom." which inspired a Homeland Security Investigations agent, Tim Ballard.

Why did you join our club?


