### **Club News**

The Board approved to help with any club DDF (District Designated Funds) in a **Global Grant Project** led by the Barrington Breakfast Rotary Club. The proyect involves a **Laboratory Technician Training** in the town of Sacatepéquez, Guatemala. The Mission Impact organization is building a facility there to offer this vocational training to women in the town of Santa María de Jesus, and surrounding areas. Lab tecnnicians are critical in towns where health monitoring is almost non existent. Laboratory tests will be available at cost the population of over 35,000 residents at the foothills of the Agua Volcano.

As mentioned above, the Rotary year starts on July 1<sup>st</sup> every year and runs until June 30<sup>th</sup>. Rotary Leadership changes at all levels; from a new Rotary International President, **R. Gordon R.
