Community Service Chair, **Steve Kutschat** brought up an issue that has been haunting not only our local communities, but the State of Illinois, and the whole world. Students are not meeting their grade level requirements nor expectations, and many parents are blaming the efficiency of the teachers while the public thinks that maybe the Boards of Education are to be blamed. Marianna pointed out that in Illinois, there are 2 million k-12 scholars; of which over 1 million belong to low income families. College enrollment is down by 8%. Everyone recognizes there is a problem. All of us at Rotary have been busy with Disaster Relief activities, Environmental Issues, Health, Hunger and Humanity projects, Disease Prevention and Medical Equipment Supply, Polio Eradication and other vaccination campaigns, Basic Literacy programs, Vocational Centers and Scholarships, Interact & Youth Exchnge ... so the question is: can Rotary do anything or more towards the education crisis? What can be done? What has been causing this crisis? Suggestions are welcome. The flyer below is self explanatory. Planning for this event took over 20 hours of Dessie's life as a volunteer to finally see it bloom last February 19th at that Scholarship Award Presentation! This local chapter is part of the Pan-Lanconian Federation of the US and Canada that originally started in the 1940s to help immigrants assimilate to new countries and still maintain a bond to language and culture. They aim to pass on to the next generations the values of education. The organization gives yearly scholarships on local and national levels and also raise funds for various causes. Dessie's local chapter, for instance helped donate medical supplies to a hospital in Sparta, and donated seed money to build the Spartan Museum in Storrs, Connecticut at the University of Connecticut.
