A Resource and Referral program to assist women prepare for reentry after incarceration.



The Intersection to Care (ITC) program is a partnership between the Rotary Club of Community Action Against Human Trafficking, Valeo Behavioral Health Care, and Shawnee County Adult Detention Center. ITC's purpose is to provide a comprehensive reintegration program for women leaving incarceration by helping them develop goals and a re-entry plan, obtain the resources needed to meet these goals, and make referrals to services post-release.

To Qualify for the ITC Program

A participant must:


- Be a woman incarcerated at the Shawnee County Adult Detention Center
- Not be in Federal or Secretary of Corrections custody.
- Not be a danger to themselves or others.
- Be willing to meet with the program Resource Liaison weekly, or as often as recommended.

Make ITC your re-entry plan.

ITC is a completely voluntary, confidential assistance program. You are not required to accept or complete any of the services. The ITC Mentors, Rotarian and community members are all volunteers who give of their time and resources to help you on your way. We believe in YOU.

Overview of ITC

The ITC program provides direct resources, re-entry planning and coordination, mentorship, behavior and substance misuse recovery meetings, and community assistance in employment and housing placement.



The ITC Resource Liaison will support the individual with accessing needed resources, including, but not limited to:

- Applying for identification documents
- Applying for birth certificate
- Transportation assistance
- Assistance obtaining a phone
- Clothing assistance
- Food assistance programs
- Substance misuse services
- Emergency housing or shelters
- Transitional housing
- Rental subsidy programs
- Education programs/ GED
- Vocational training
- KU Technology education program
- Health & dental care
- Health Insurance
- Credit counseling
- Employment placement services
- Mental health services
- Victim survivor services
