ROTARY CLUB OF KITANTE IMPACT REPORT

Introduction:

The Rotary Club of Kitante and its Implementing partner Purple Skills Clinic Foundation is pleased to report on the success of the Kamwokya Boy Child Skilling Program, which aimed to empower marginalized boys from the Kamwokya slum community through short courses in disciplines such as Deejaing, Digital Marketing, Graphics and Animation, Photography, videography, Multimedia, and Public Speaking. The program sponsored 3 cohorts a group of **60 boys**, 20 have successfully graduated, 40 yet to graduate this year (2026) with **31** of the boys already employed and **19** doing gig work another are continuing their job shadow program.

The Process of Implementing the program

- a) Awareness stage: We selected the 20 boys through a transparent process. We made awareness about the Kamwokya Boy Child Program with support from Local Council leaders, churches, and Mosques. We also used online social media platforms to generate awareness.
- b) Call for applications: We then put a call for applications and we got an over whelming number of applicants of boys from Kamwokya slum area.
- c) Selection: Out of the hundreds of applicants, we selected 20 boys based on their age, place of stay, ability to read and write especially since they were going to interact with digital technology among other qualities
- d) Orientation: The Boys were briefed and underwent orientation both from the President Rotary club of Kitante and the administration of Purple Skills Clinic preparing them on what to expect from the program.
- e) Skilling Program: The boys have spent 2 months being skilled in various disciplines and the lessons are majorly practical in nature with project works given weekly.
- f) Mentorship: We integrated soft skills such as branding, communication, and marketing
- g) Job Shadow Program: At the end of the program, we assigned the students internship placement in partner companies and organization to gain at work experience.
- h) Graduation: The boys were assessed by the Directorate of industrial training (DIT) under ministry of Education and Sports with the DIT Executive Director Dr Patrick Byakatonda presiding over the graduation as the Vice Chancellor.

The program has achieved an **83.3% economic activation rate** across all three cohorts:3

- **Livelihood Improvement:** Graduates now use their skills to design graphics for small businesses, mix music at events plus clubs, and edit videos to support their families' and themselves.
- **Socio-Economic Mobility:** Successful employment has enabled some students to improve their living conditions and even relocate from the Kamwokya slum area as their income stabilized.
- **Sustainable Career Paths:** Over **70% of graduates** historically secure jobs or start small businesses, proving the effectiveness of the training.

Kiyingi Elivic (A.K.A Kante)and Kulaba Robert (A.K.A Frozen), both school dropouts from Kamwokya slums, struggled to make ends meet. Their lives changed when they joined Rotary Club of Kitante & Purple Skills Klinik Foundation's Kamwokya Boy Child Program. Through mentorship and training in digital skills, Kante studied graphic designing and frozen studied videography after gaining practical skills there joined and co-founded Kante & Frozen Events. 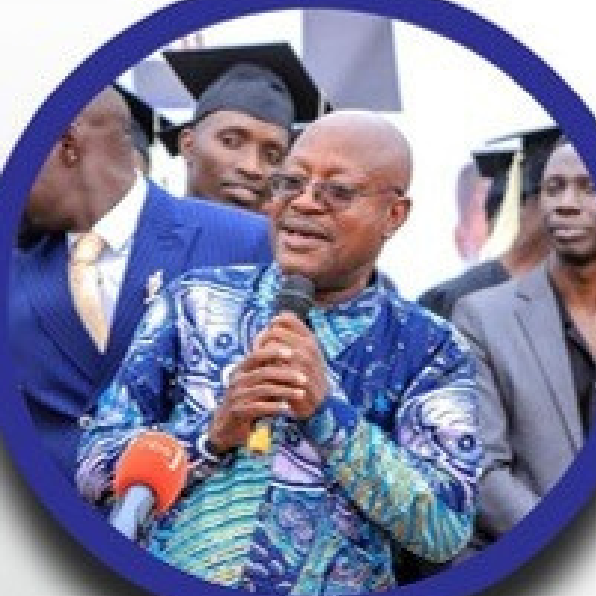

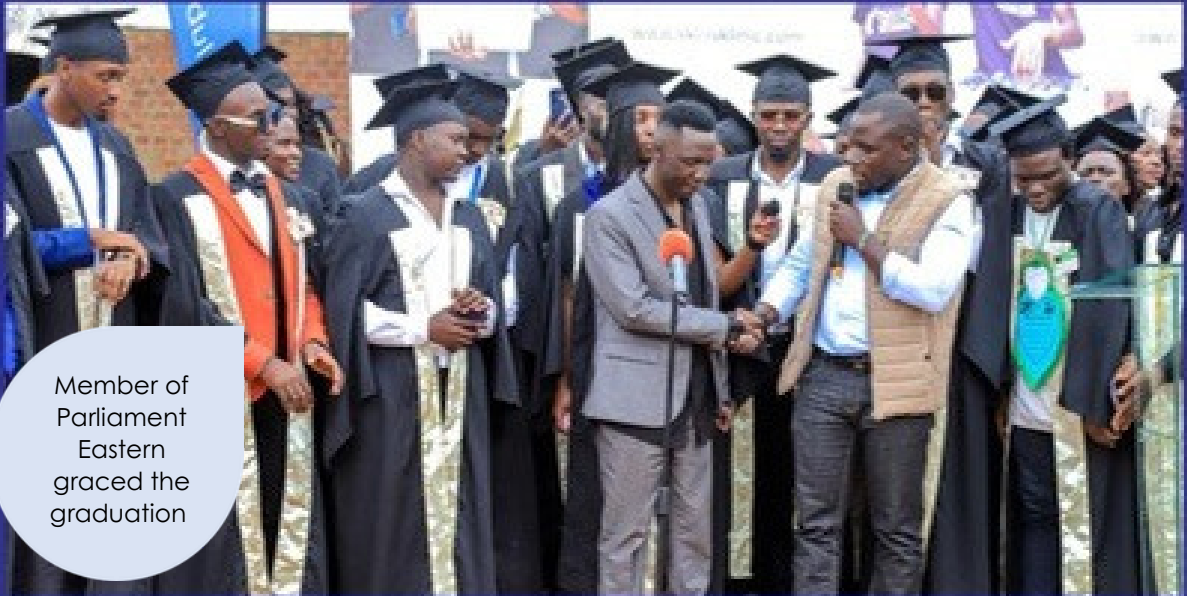
